Somerset Children's Center



It is October, and the Somerset Children's Center is ready for Halloween! We welcome back the families who were on vacation and look forward to another successful year! Halloween is approaching and for many it is filled with parties, Trick or Treating, and fall activities.

There are some children, however, who have sensory processing challenges and may become overwhelmed by the festivities. There are tips for parents to help prepare for this very special holiday.

Reading books, creating social stories, and rehearsing the routine of the day may help alleviate some of the uneasiness. Parents can explain why some rules, such as "Don't take candy from strangers" are allowed on Halloween. Practicing how to go door to door (to friends' houses), say "Trick or Treat" and "thank you" will give them assurance and a sense of independence once Halloween comes.

Costumes play an important role in Halloween. Children should try the costumes on ahead of time to make sure they fit comfortably and do not itch or hinder movement. Make sure they are comfortable wearing a coat over their costume if necessary and explain the reasoning beforehand. Masks are too restrictive, and make-up on their faces may make them feel uncomfortable. "Less is more" should be considered for children with sensory needs.

If Trick or Treating is not appropriate for your family, you may want to plan an event or home party. Friends can come over for an arts and crafts project or to play games. If carving a pumpkin is too "gooshy," stickers or paint should be considered. Sometimes a fall family outing such as apple picking, going on a hayride, or just taking a trip to the local farm is a nice Halloween treat.

It is important to remember that Halloween is a scary time for many. The flashing lights, spooky sounds, and frightening costumes can create anxiety for many children. Pay attention to "sensory overload" to avoid meltdowns. Remember, although it may be challenging at times, children develop a sense of independence, confidence, and an understanding that they were able to work through their apprehensions.
